EASTER SUNDAY OF THE RESURRECTION OF THE LORD

It was just last Sunday and we all triumphantly welcomed Jesus riding on a donkey through town. Everyone was shouting “Hosanna to the Son of David. Blessed is He who comes in the name of the Lord, the King of Israel.” What happened just five days later? I could not believe it. These same people completely turned on Him. They want Him crucified! And for what? I felt so terrible inside especially for all that he went through – the scourging, the mockery, the crowning of thorns, forced to carry his own cross, the nails and finally suffocation. Mary, his mother, and John held each other sobbing beyond grief. For three days we were devastated and lost. But then the news came.

Jesus, who was dead, is alive!

He Is Risen!

Alleluia!



CHRIST IS RISEN! ALLELUIA!

Easter speaks to us of God’s deep love for us, of his forgiveness, of his gift of the Eucharist and of the Spirit he sent to be among us. Easter tells us that Jesus lived among us, died and rose again from the dead in order to make God’s love visible on earth. The Church continues to make this love visible today. We are the Church. To find the risen Lord today we need only to look to each other to find his love and compassion.

Easter does not end on Sunday. It continues through fifty days, right up to the feast of Pentecost. After his resurrection, Jesus appeared to his disciples, who rejoiced at seeing him.

When Jesus finally left his Apostles and ascended into heaven, he told them, “You are my witnesses” and promised to be with them all days. And he sent them the gift of the Holy Spirit to strengthen their faith and set their hearts on fire. As members of the Church, we received this same commission, this same gift.

May the Risen Christ live in all of us. May we be his good and faithful witnesses. And may the Spirit enflame our hearts to proclaim the Good News always! May all of us have a joyous Easter.

FIRST EUCHARIST

We will have 1st Eucharist during the Sunday liturgies on April 21 & 22, April 28 & 29. The 1st Communions will be celebrated during the 5:30, 7:30, 9, 10:30 and noon masses.

Sacraments are parish celebrations. In parishes that celebrate first Eucharist at weekend liturgies, the comment is often heard: "I was grateful and privileged to be a part of this celebration." These celebrations help the entire parish to pause and reflect on our identity as a Eucharistic community. They can be a deepening renewal of faith for all ages.

Children and families belong to the parish, not just to a religious education program, or a school, or only to "this year's first Communion class." All that we do in religious education or school should incorporate children (and their families) into the life of the parish, help them to experience that their faith is about much more than just going to class, more than just learning in an academic setting. A parish celebration of first Eucharist which integrates children into the Sunday assembly and takes them beyond their small "learning group" is one way to illustrate this. Belonging to the parish will be their reality throughout the rest of their life. All that we do should help them to experience this community membership, so that their memories are parish experiences, not just school or religious education experiences.

Young people need to know how important they are to the Church. They are not just the future Church, but the Church of today. The Church would be incomplete without children and youth. We need them as much as they need the witness and experience of maturing faith. They should feel that they belong to and are valued by the parish community by people they might not know by name but with whom they worship each weekend.
