YEAR OF FAITH 2012

Downton Abbey has been one of the most popular shows on television the last couple of years. It takes viewers into the early twentieth-century world of English wealth and privileges. What makes the show so addictive is not only having entry into the “upstairs” realm of the Earl and Countess of Grantham and their family, but also into the “downstairs” world of the servants. The loyalty and dedication often found here brings to mind what Jesus calls for from his disciples in today’s Gospel. Jesus says “Be like servants who await their master’s return from a wedding, ready to open immediately when he comes and knocks. Blessed are those servants whom the master finds vigilant on his arrival.” Jesus says that the master himself will serve them at table. The mark of a good servant is one who is watching, not only for the Lord’s return but for those who might harm his household. The mark of good servants includes not mistreating those entrusted to their care. Trustworthy servants will find a trustworthy master returning to care for them.

How are we being called to serve the Lord and his household while we await his return?
