We were also chosen...

During the lazy days of summer, our routines may allow time to think about things you haven't thought about in awhile. One of the things may be God's call in your life – yes your life! Amos in the first reading was a common man who responded to God's call to prophesy to the corrupt leader Amaziah. Amos could have dismissed the call, saying it would be better for a more educated person, but instead Amos responded to God's call. Like Amos, God doesn't call us because we are holy and blameless, instead God calls us that we may become holy and blameless. The reading from Ephesians tells us we too are chosen, destined to a purpose God has for our lives.

Responding to God's call in our lives is an ongoing experience. Sorry, but God doesn't use e-mail, Twitter or US Mail to explain the call, rather God uses the lazy days of summer to bring His call to us. God uses the experiences of life as times when he calls us to special experiences that provide meaning and direction in our lives. God's call is too important to ignore.

When you respond to God's call, self sacrifice may be required, not to mention the risks of rejection or failure. But don't be discouraged, the results shouldn't be evaluated on our standards – let God decide if your call was successful. Be open to God's call in your life. Travel light and walk in confidence that God has chosen you and will walk with you.

Catholicism 101: Culture, Wit, and Wisdom

Q: Does the Pope have a telescope?

A: Yes.... well, sort of. The "Pope scope" is stored at the Vatican Observatory, which is one of the oldest astronomical research facilities in the world. It has roots back as far as 1582 and Pope Gregory XIII; the modern observatory was constructed in the 1930's and entrusted to the care of the Society of Jesus (Jesuits). There are two campuses of the Vatican Observatory: the Pope's summer residence, Castel Gandolfo, and, in Arizona. Over the years, this observatory has noted the positions of over 5000 stars in the evening sky. Although Pope Benedict does not seem to have a passion for Astronomy (outside of observing the complimentary nature between faith and science), Pope Pius XII was very much interested in Astronomy, and the Vatican Observatory's website lists him as an "amateur astronomer." So keep looking up, observing the beauty of God's creation in your nighttime sky!
