

SIXTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Like Sheep without a Shepherd

In times of discord, it is difficult to be mindful of God's call that we live in unity. Passages from Jeremiah and St. Paul (Ephesians) both share this beautiful exhortation to be one with God. In Mark's Gospel, we find Jesus searching for quiet reflection, but drawn to unifying and caring for his "flock" with loving compassion. He wanted to be secluded, but he "was moved to pity," and he could not leave the "vast crowd." For those who work with children, there are often times that the gift of quiet reflection may have to be pushed aside so that the needs of the children are met with patient tenderness, much as Jesus met the needs of his followers.

There is no doubt that we all need quiet time to reflect – a time to separate ourselves from the "selfie" generation with all of the tweets, texts, and email monologues. The silence and separation from technology can be a mind-washing, soul-filling experience! Jesus and the apostles were in need of that deserted place; however, Jesus was filled with compassion, and chose shepherding his flock over his own needs. Even when *we least want to give of ourselves*, we are asked to open our hearts and to love as Jesus loved.
