THE YEAR OF MERCY

FIFTH SUNDAY OF LENT

Recently the actor Alan Rickman passed away from cancer. There was an article written about him when he spoke to a drama school class in England. Here is the full link: (http://aleteia.org/2016/03/08/how-alan-rickmans-views-on-villains-can-instruct-our-faith/). During this class a student asked him how he felt making a career by playing villains on screen. His response was very poignant. He said he never played villains. His response helped these aspiring actors to remember that they are to find the humanity of each character they play, not the label of villain or hero.

Today our Gospel is the woman caught in adultery. The unfortunate woman was brought to Jesus not to have a ruling brought against her, but to trick Jesus. So the Pharisees and Scribes were using her to get a charge against Jesus. This is an important part of this Gospel, since these Scribes and Pharisees did not see her as a human being but an object to further their own agenda. Jesus turns the tables on them and shows that they too have sinned in their life and have no reason to pass judgment on her. Jesus writing on the ground in the Gospel story could be him writing the sins of the Scribes and Pharisees for all to see as they did to her.

On this day Jesus reminds us that God calls us to repentance and forgiveness. He calls us to see the humanity of all people and realize that we too could be in the same spot as the other person, or have been in their spot. He calls us to see others through the eyes of God, not the eyes of self-righteousness or self-elevated pride.
