And whoever loves me will be loved by my Father.* John 14:20-21

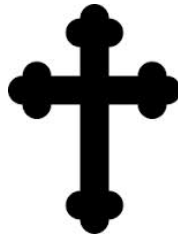

LITURGICAL BITS & BYTES Same Mass

Q: Is it true to say that the Mass is the same in every church?

A: Yes and no. The basic structure is the same. The readings assigned for the day are the same in every Catholic church (and even followed in some Protestant churches). There will be variations in the ritual and these are based on local customs. For example, if you were to go to Mass in the southwestern U.S. where the people were predominately Hispanic, there would be different (and probably more) music and maybe even a Mariachi band. The structure and the words would be the same. Each faith community has its own local customs that help them express their worship. For example, in some parishes the people hold hands during the Our Father. The fact that other churches may not do that does not make it right or wrong, just different.
