TWENTY-NINTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Give thanks to God!

The world can sometimes be a frightening place, and when we move away from God – away from Christ – we are most filled with fears. The readings today contain more than elegant prose about Christ’s majesty and His authority. The readings help us find safety and protection in the new order of our world. St. Paul’s letter to the Thessalonians also gives us a powerful avenue out of darkness through the simple act of giving thanks when he promises that, “We always give thanks to God for all of you . . .”

Giving thanks to God can be a most significant prayer in its simplicity. Sitting in Church can be a time when so many of the world’s problems fill our minds. The daily distractions from the obligations of work or home can take away from our time with God. Try this prayer: *Thank you, thank you, God. Thank you.* If we keep our focus on thanking God and “unceasingly calling to mind God’s work of faith and labor of love and endurance in hope,” we will find that our minds become filled with abundant images of the gifts we have: family, friends, the gift of life, and this day and this moment that you have to spend with God.

Corporal

The word “corporal” derives from a Latin word that means “body.” The corporal we use at Mass is a square piece of white cloth placed in the center of the altar, on top of the altar cloth. It is a place on which to rest the vessels containing the consecrated bread and wine, that is, the Body and Blood of Christ. It is folded in thirds, one third in from each side and one third each from the top and the bottom. The idea is to contain any crumbs that might fall from the hosts or bread being consecrated.
